


How Are You Connecting?

A Way to Connect

Words from One of Our Worship Associates

Nearly a year ago, **Mike Cox**, acting as Worship Associate for a Sunday Worship Service, shared these thoughts about connecting with others. Because they are **so applicable in the time of self-isolation**, we thought they would be good to share again. (Edited for length.)

I have found over the past decade that small acts of thoughtfulness can make a real difference in people's lives...yes, it is a self-evident truth, but for some of us who struggle to show our thanks and affection to people, the little acts of connecting with people are important.

Over 10 years ago I noticed at work that many of my friends and colleagues complained that they did not feel valued. I am sure this is a common complaint by people in many organizations, and I am guessing it probably occurs even here at Cedars...I decided I would try and rectify that in my small way.

Around the first of each year I would write a short hand-written note to about 10 people telling them why I valued their work and valued them. ..Well, the response was overwhelmingly positive...And a positive, unintended consequence was that I received nice feedback, which is always welcome.

We hope that you have been able to take some time to read our *Paving Our Way stewardship brochure*. While many things are closed right now, **Cedars has remained open--virtually**. **Rev. Zackrie**, the Cedars Board, and the staff are offering virtual services, town hall meetings, committee meetings, choir rehearsals, shared reflection time, and continued service by e-mail and mail.

Rev. Zackrie recently secured an emergency grant from UUA to purchase equipment so that we can use technology even more to inform, share, and commune with each other virtually.

... The majority of people were thankful for the simple notes. And the ones who were the most thankful were the friends of my parents who wrote back relating stories about my parents and me when I was young.

...For me this [became] a way to show that each of those people was special to me in some fashion...

[We all need to feel valued.] *I would challenge each of you to take a few moments..to perform those small acts of kindness that provide others with the knowledge that they matter, they are loved, and they are*

Notes from April 1 Town Hall Meeting

Be sure to join the Zoom sessions each Wednesday morning and evening: **Morning Reflection at 10:00 a.m.** and **Cedars Town Hall at 6:00 p.m.** (See links in calendar listing.) Here is a recap of the April 1st Town Hall Meeting.

Rev. Zackrie opened the meeting with the chalice lighting and some gentle breathing exercises. He reminded us that this is a good time to be calm and reflective.

Board President, **Heidi Parkington-Thal**, shared that some nearby church communities do have members who have tested positive for the COVID-10 virus. While the Cedars community misses the opportunity to worship together, hold committee meetings, and make social contact, we are grateful that our caution is keeping people relatively safe and healthy. We are saddened by the news of suffering in our neighboring communities and are mindful of the need to be fastidious in our own person habits. *Stay safe!*

Heidi also reminded everyone that this is the active **Stewardship Campaign** season! Many pledges have been received online and through US Mail, and the amount pledged thus far is more than half way to this year's annual goal. *Please remember this campaign and go online or send in your pledge and your check.* Our US mail is being checked regularly, and checks will get to our bookkeeper in a timely way.

During Shelter-in-Place, the **Cedars Board** continues to meet the church's financial obligations, such as rent to The Island School and wages for employees. The ability to meet these obligations will be examined each month during this critical time. How to Communicate Now

During the Shelter-in-Place, your Cedars staff and Board of Trustees continue to conduct church business and to work on your behalf. Our goal is to maintain contact with our Cedars Members and Friends while staying in compliance with government directives and recommendations. We are following practices that consider the health and well-being of our Cedars community. Use of E-mail:

In order to keep you informed, we may be sending out more e-mail messages than we normally would. This is meant to be helpful to you, not to crowd your in-box. We are using our best judgment about what to send/when, and we apologize for the increased number of messages, but hope you will benefit from the information.

During this weekend, **Rev. Zackrie** will be taking his regular monthly weekend off. It is well-deserved, as he took no time off in March. The Sunday Worship Service will be led by **Rev. Jessica Star Rockers**. Shortly before that service begins, she will send out the YouTube Live link. The following Sunday will be **Easter Sunday**, and the service will be led jointly by **Rev. Zackrie** and **Rev. Jessica Star Rockers**.

Close to 30 people joined the meeting on Wednesday night, and they shared some of the ways in which people are coping with self-isolation. (See **In Our Community**.)

Rev. Zackrie closed the meeting with a reminder that it still is possible to look out into the world from our separate homes. When we do, we will see many ways in which we are connected. He shared <u>The Spirit</u> <u>Neither Sorts nor Separates</u>, a poem by Linda Gregg.

Be Patient, Be Calm

During this time of health concerns and relative social isolation, it will help if you remain patient, stay calm, and keep informed.

- Refer to local health agencies for official communications about COVID-19 and recommendations for preventing the spread of the virus.
- Pay attention to those groups that are at increased levels of vulnerability to the virus.
- Make sure your contact information at Cedars is up to date.
- Check your e-mail, social media, and the Cedars website regularly.

Keep in mind these personal hygiene recommendations from health professionals:

- Wash hands regularly (for at least 20 seconds) with soap and water.
- Apply hand sanitizer when washing is not an option.
- Cough and sneeze into the crook of your arm.
- Stay home, as WA state has ordered.
- Observe *physical distancing* recommendations when you are out.
- Avoid touching your face.
