

I have a few quick updates that I want to share with folks about summer programming here at Cedars.

For the months of July and August, Cedars will continue to participate in worship services with the Puget Sound Worship Collaborative. These services combine participants from four churches and give voice to the theme for each month. For the rest of the month of July, we will continue to explore the theme of Courage before transitioning to the theme of *Journey* for the month of



August. Starting in September we will move back to a worship service format similar to what we had this spring.

In addition, at last week's Wednesday virtual Town Hall, the gathered group made the decision to switch these meetings to alternating weeks for the time being. This means that the next Town Hall meeting will be on July 22nd and then every other week going forward. In addition, we are rethinking the purpose of this meeting and considering ways to make it a more engaging space for those who attend.




the only one to respond - and his response is magnificent:

acting, drawing, painting, sculpting, poetry, fiction, essays, reportage, no matter how well or badly, not to get money and fame, but to experience becoming, to find out what's inside you, to make your soul grow.

Seriously! I mean starting right now, do art and do it for the rest of your lives. Draw a funny or nice picture of Ms. Lockwood, and give it to her. Dance home after school, and sing in the shower and on and on. Make a face in your mashed potatoes. Pretend you're Count Dracula.

Here's an assignment for tonight, and I hope Ms. Lockwood will flunk you if you do not do it: Write a six line poem, about anything, but rhymed. No fair tennis without a net. Make it as good as you possibly can. But don't tell anybody what you're doing. Don't show it or recite it to anybody, not even your girlfriend, or parents, or whatever, or Ms. Lockwood. OK?

Tear it up into teeny-weeny pieces, and discard them into widely separated trash receptacles. You will find that you have already been gloriously rewarded for your poem. You have experienced becoming, learned a lot more about what's inside you, and you have made your soul grow.
