## Join Our Team!

If you would like to give virtual worship design a try, now is the perfect time. The **Worship Team** is looking to expand its membership and add a few new *Worship Associates* as well as people to help with virtual worship *Tech Support* and *Video Editing*. Below is a short list of the responsibilities for these two positions.

#### **Worship Associate**

- 1. Provide meaningful spiritual/emotional reflection on worship service themes.
- 2. Record service elements, such as the Welcome, Offering, and Chalice Lighting/Extinguishing.
- 3. Coordinate with **Rev. Zackrie** and other members of the Worship Team to set service themes and craft worship services.
- Help support other worship activities as requested (i.e. Wednesday Morning Reflection, memorial services, etc.)

The ideal candidate for this role would be someone comfortable recording service elements and working with the rest of the team to design and edit worship services.

## **Tech Support**

- 1. Help service leaders produce video clips for Sunday worship service elements (meditations, prayers, readings, etc.).
- 2. Provide technical assistance to people participating in virtual services (i.e. help record testimonials or create picture slideshows)
- 3. Add lyrics to recorded hymns.
- 4. Act as a host for *YouTube Live/Zoom* chat during the worship service and coffee hour.
- Use software like Open Broadcast Software, Shot Cut, and Zoom to provide technical support to guest preachers. (Some training will be provided by Rev. Zackrie.)
- 6. Help others develop technical proficiency.

# Special Collection for August: UU the Vote Partner Organization

In the month of August, our donations will be shared with the UU the Vote partner Center for Common Dreams and their Reclaim Our Vote initiative.

Around the country, Unitarian Universalists are organizing to #UUtheVote, working to increase the participation of millions of disenfranchised, eligible voters--especially people of color. UU the Vote (uuthevote.org) is a national campaign working with the non-profit Center for Common Dreams. The Reclaim our Vote initiative is engaging voters who have been prevented from exercising their electoral rights through voter suppression and voter list purging.
