# From the Worship Team

#### Join Our Team!

If you would like to give virtual worship design a try, now is the perfect time. The **Worship Team** is looking to expand its membership and add a few new *Worship Associates* as well as people to help with virtual worship *Tech Support* and *Video Editing*. Below is a short list of the responsibilities for these two positions.

#### **Worship Associate**

- Provide meaningful spiritual/emotional reflection on worship service themes.
- 2. Record service elements, such as the Welcome, Offering, and Chalice Lighting/Extinguishing.
- 3. Coordinate with **Rev. Zackrie** and other members of the Worship Team to set service themes and craft worship services.
- 4. Help support other worship activities as requested (i.e. Wednesday Morning Reflection, memorial services, etc.)

The ideal candidate for this role would be someone comfortable recording service elements and working with the rest of the team to design and edit worship services.

#### **Tech Support**

- 1. Help service leaders produce video clips for Sunday worship service elements (meditations, prayers, readings, etc.).
- 2. Provide technical assistance to people participating in virtual services (i.e. help record testimonials or create picture slideshows)
- 3. Add lyrics to recorded hymns.
- 4. Act as a host for *YouTube Live/Zoom* chat during the worship service and coffee hour.
- Use software like Open Broadcast Software, Shotcut, and Zoom to provide technical support to guest preachers. (Some training will be provided by Rev. Zackrie.)
- 6. Help others develop technical proficiency.

The ideal person for this role would have some experience with video production and editing--or be eager to learn.

Breaking and Blessing: Meditations by Rev. Sean Parker Dennison. In Breaking and Blessing, the 2020 volume of the InSpirit Series, Rev. Sean Parker Dennison imagines letters from angels, draws on the natural world, and reflects on love and calling. They chart a path, moving here and there, as if across a constellation-connecting mathematics to love, stars to saplings, and breaking to blessing. Rev. Dennison's striking debut will serve as both solace and flame to readers looking for them in equal measure.

Spilling the Light: Meditations on Hope and Resilience by Rev. Theresa I. Soto. At once deeply compassionate and spiritually empowering, this collection of inspirational poetry provides pastoral care and an encouragement for authentic living. In this 2019 volume of the InSpirit Series, one of the most creative voices in Unitarian Universalism today tends to our souls and emboldens us to become our truest selves. Rev. Soto's poems of hope and resilience validate our identities and our humanity--especially for those of us marginalized by mainstream culture.

Love Like Thunder: Meditations by Jess Reynolds. In Love Like Thunder, the 2018 volume of the InSpirit Series, a vibrant new poetic voice invites us into an intimate relationship with nature, God, and love itself. Jess Reynolds weeps in the desert at night, meditates on heart emojis, lets a river of love run wildly in their body and together with their partner God goes to couples counseling to find their way. Jess Reynolds' lyric poetry flows like water between genders, between body and spirit, and between earth and sky.

To Wake, To Rise: Meditations on Justice and Resilience edited by Rev. William G. Sinkford. The 2017 edition of the InSpirit Series is an anthology of 29 poems, prayers, and reflections about resisting oppression and keeping the faith in social action work. Written by a range of contributors, including ministers and lay leaders, these readings are ideal for both private contemplation and for use in worship. Collected and introduced by a former president of the UUA-and the first Black person to hold that position--these meditations are both a support for activists and a call to action in a new era of political and social division.


