## Celebrating Life by Honoring our Dead

## An online workshop for individuals and families Led by Johanna Munson and Kathryn Jay

Join us to explore how those who have died have affected our life. How can remembering them help us open up to talk about death? What ways have we learned to cope with the idea of death, and how can we create an affirmative approach?

The workshop begins with choosing a person or an animal to honor, then bringing in memories that call that person close. We'll honor them in the second session by exhibiting creative works made during the intervening week-- sculpture, collage, poetry, music- anything goes! Images from this session will be recorded and compiled into a video to be shown to a wider audience.

In the third session we'll turn to how to approach the topic of our own death, and reflect on how we'd like to be remembered. The 4th week we'll share our creations in a compilation video, along with the impact of the workshop. All are invited to join in that session.

This online workshop takes place on Zoom in four sessions, 10/6, 10/13, 10/20, and 10/27 (all Tuesdays) from 7:00 p.m. to 8:15 p.m. Please commit to participating in all four sessions. ## **Cedars Creativity Fair 2020**

## Coping with Social Isolation See What Others Have Been Doing

As first announced several months ago, we have organized a Cedars response to the social isolation in which we all now find ourselves. Missing each other, our identity as a congregational community is suffering, although we are coping as individuals.

Our response has been to re-imagine and present a virtual version of the several after-service **Creativity Fairs** that were held in Webster Hall in recent years. Organized to provide opportunities to see and appreciate artful products and demonstrations of the creativity present in our talented and capable congregation, those fairs also helped us get to know each other better.

Now, the **2020 Cedars Creativity Fair** has opened. Presented as an album of photos on our **Cedars Facebook page**, it is open to everyone, but it also is just a beginning. Everyone is invited to share what they've been doing or creating during this time of isolation.

The theme of the summit will be *Committing Ourselves to the Great Turning*.

Racial justice, environmental justice, RIMS (Refugee, Immigrant, and Migrant Solidarity), and legislative advocacy will be the focus of a sequence of plenary sessions on **October 10**. The online format allows us to feature national, regional, and local panelists. This format allows you to attend all of the sessions, or just those of greatest interest to you.

The **December 5th sessions**, following the 2020 elections, will be geared toward justice organizing and actions for congregations, justice partners, and JUUstice Washington in 2021 and beyond.

The film was nominated for Best Foreign Language Film in 1965.


Marvin Evans Reading Group Tuesday, October 13, 1:30 p.m. Virtual Discussion Using Zoom
