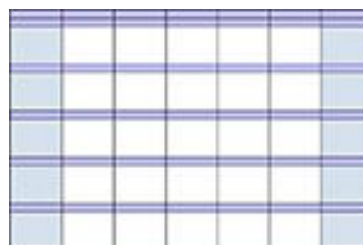

Safe Gatherings at Cedars

Our congregation values using sound science and following advice of health agencies to adapt our safety guidelines to the changing status of the COVID-19 virus. You may find our current **COVID Safety Guidelines on the Cedars Website**. It now includes the current Community Risk Level and a table describing what precautions we are implementing for indoor gatherings. We are currently at GREEN, meaning Masking is optional, but Masks are required when singing.

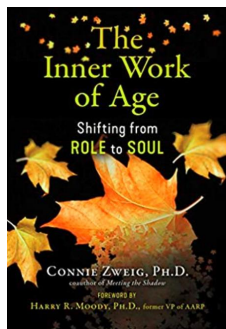
The Cedars Board of Trustees has also decided to no longer require vaccinations at gatherings, though we do ask that all unvaccinated individuals wear masks and maintain appropriate physical distancing at all times. Community vaccination rates in Kitsap County are now at 80% and we know that a few people at Cedars have not been able to obtain vaccines. Our gathering precautions include social and physical distancing and increased ventilation at the current Community Risk Level.

The people at Cedars UU Church care deeply about each other and the community we have built together. We trust that each person will act responsibly to protect themselves and others using masks, distancing, and other precautions. Following these guidelines will allow more people to gather and join in experiences safely.

We are all in this together, and as we say in unison on Sundays: let's "treat all people kindly because we are one family."

Climate Smart Challenge

Water Plants Just Enough this Summer



With temperatures rising, you and your plants may be getting more sun than normal. In the summer months it's easy to want to "overwater" outdoor plants to make sure they have enough, but too much water is wasteful and can harm plants. Here are some tips to keep your landscape healthy without wasting water.

- Use a moisture meter to see if your yard needs water; if the meter says it's moist, you can skip running the sprinklers (available at local hardware stores for around \$20)
- Make sure your irrigation system has a rain sensor that shuts off the system when it rains and allows it to turn back on when it stops
- Avoid watering in the middle of the day when the hot sun will evaporate much of the water before it can get to thirsty plants
- Avoid using the hose for plants, and instead opt for a water can or drip system

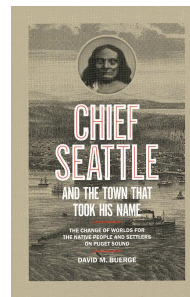

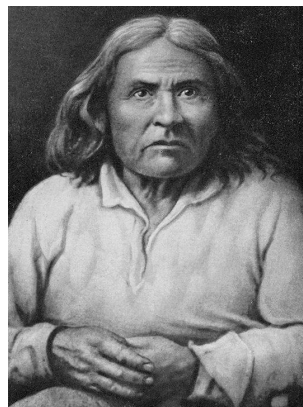
friend Marvin Evans used to say, we meet to discuss books that can intrigue and might enlighten us.

Pastoral Care Concerns

Cedars Teams

Currently, our Cedars Teams are inactive. As we began meeting in-person again after Covid safety protocols were implemented, it was soon clear that the Cedars Teams had lost participants and there were not enough people to handle setup duties.

Because setup is still necessary, we have eliminated or simplified some of the things we do and created new Task Teams responsible for Setup Leadership, Worship Setup, and Hospitality/Greeting. Each Task Team has a leader and ideally 4-5 members made up of people attending the in-person services. The leader schedules the rotation of duties.
