Emerson & Me

For many people today, Ralph Waldo Emerson is a quaint relic of the nineteenth century, or worse yet, a dead white male with little to offer contemporary Americans. Not so for me. I have spent many years reading and reflecting on his writings. I have taught classes, led workshops, and written several books about him. I have tried to explain his ideas as best I can. Sometimes people ask me, "Why do you read



him? What does he mean to you? How has he made a difference in your life?" The short answer is that he has been a wise companion and spiritual guide on my life journey.

Rev. Barry Andrews is Minister Emeritus of the Unitarian Congregation at Shelter Rock, Manhasset, New York, and is the author of numerous books on Transcendentalism and Transcendentalist authors, most recently "The Gospel According to This Moment: The spiritual Message of Henry David Thoreau," published by the University of Massachusetts Press. Since his retirement in 2011, he and his wife, Linda, have been living on Bainbridge Island.

The Board feels that gathering thoughtful input from as many members as possible, is vital to helping us chart our path forward. Every member should make their best efforts to attend a Listening Circle OR let us know if you are unable to attend and we will make alternative arrangements to receive your input.

After all of the Listening Circles have been held, the Board will prepare a written report and hold a **Town Hall meeting at The Island School after the Sunday service on October 13th (around 11:15 am)** to present a summary of the report and offer a time for questions and answers, as well as a time for everyone to talk about their own observations and ideas for opportunities in response to the report.

Super Supper and Community Kitchen Sign-Ups


